

Linda C. Giudice, MD, PhD is Distinguished Professor and Chair of Obstetrics, Gynecology and Reproductive Sciences at the University of California, San Francisco. She is a biochemist, gynecologist, and reproductive endocrinologist who specializes clinically in endometriosis, implantation and ovulatory disorders and infertility. Her research focuses on endometrial function and regeneration, endometriosis, inflammation and reproductive outcomes, placental-uterine interactions and environmental impacts on reproductive health. Dr. Giudice earned her Ph.D. in biochemistry at UCLA, did postdoctoral research at Rockefeller University with Nobel Laureate Gunter Blobel, and at the NIH. She earned her MD at Stanford University and completed a residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology and a fellowship in Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility at Stanford. She has mentored over 200 students, fellows, and faculty, and has authored over 250 peer-reviewed publications. Dr. Giudice is co-editor of four textbooks on women's health, reproductive environmental health, endometrium, and endometriosis. She is the Immediate Past-President of the ASRM and current President of the World Endometriosis Society and is the recipient of numerous awards for her contributions in research, mentoring, and environmental health. Dr. Giudice currently serves on the March of Dimes Scientific Advisory Council and is an elected member of the Institute of Medicine of the National Academies in the U.S., one of the nation's highest honors in the fields of health and medicine.
